Course title: Freedom of speech in Hungary in International Context

Course content: One of the major areas of testing the quality of the new democracies in Central- and Eastern Europe since 1990 has been the problem of free speech. The seminary course addresses both international and Hungarian aspects of the dilemmas of both protecting the freedom of public expression of even hateful views on the one hand and the social groups potentially targeted by such acts of public free speech on the other hand.

Requirements: The course can only be taken by students capable of preparing for written tests from readings in English of 200-300 pages for the entire semester, and to participate seminary discussions in English as part of the final grade.
