Course title: Film Theory Seminar: Post-Cinema: New Theories of the Moving

Course type: Seminar

Course content: The seminar tackles issues related to the recent proliferation of different types of the moving image. We begin by defining what digital cinema is, and how film has entered the age of post-continuity, then discuss different aesthetic and formal features of post-cinematic media, to turn later to techniques and technologies that mean a complete departure from 20th century cinematic methods. We shall also tackle issues of politics and archeologies of post-cinema (beyond traditional media archeology) to arrive at questions posed by ecologies of postcinema. Readings address the digital shift and its consequences and effects both on the subject and its wider context in society and the Anthropocene.
