Course title: Storytelling: Documentaries

Course Type: Lecture/Seminar/Practical Work

Course content: The course aims to discover the editor's role in a documentary and also

to examine whether documentaries are different from fiction,

storytelling-wise. At the beginning of the term, a short documentary, **Domestic**, a short documentary will be screened. It serves as a keynote to our further discussions. We will watch and talk about **Tarnation** by Jonathan Caouette, as an example of the performative documentary. Later we watch an observational documentary, **The Steam of Life** as the indicative assignment will be based on this film. Throughout the semester students have to develop a treatment based

on a chosen character from the film. In the second half of the term, we will analyze Michael Glawogger's **Workingman's Death**.

Requirements: Active participation in the classes

Proper delivery of the treatment assignment

At least 51% on their exam.

Learning outcomes: With the help of the indicative readings/podcast and discussions

students will get a clear picture of making documentaries. They will learn to prepare for shooting, learn different attitudes in documentary filmmaking and they will also learn how to think in the editing room. Documentaries are not very different from fiction as documentaries also

have a script but are written in the editing room.
